**INSPIRE Trustee and Patron Mrs Gillian Matthews MBE**: I am sad to report that a much loved and respected supporter of INSPIRE, Gillian Matthews, passed away on 7<sup>th</sup> August. Gill was a young mother of four children, including twin boys aged three, when she broke her back (complete T5) falling from her horse 'Sunsketch' at the Larkhill Point to Point in 1965.

After six months' rehabilitation at Stoke Mandeville, she went on to represent UK in four Paralympic Games and in 1988 became the Paralympic World Champion Table Tennis player in Brisbane. Gill served as a Dorset JP and Magistrate from 1978 – 2006 and was made an MBE in 2004 for her Services to Charity. Having served as a Trustee of the INSPIRE Foundation for eight years, she agreed to become a Patron in 2013.
